## Handpicked Productions is awarded funding from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for new exciting heritage project, Sekers Objects.



Handpicked Productions based in West Cumbria has received a grant of £78,452 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for Sekers Objects, an exciting two-year heritage project in partnership with Sekers Fabrics, University of Cumbria and Rosehill Theatre. Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, the project focuses on the creation of a crowd sourced digital Sekers Fabrics archive.

Sekers Fabrics was established in 1938 in Whitehaven, and quickly established itself as an innovative design house and silk mill, supplying the haute couture fashion scene. A significant local employer, nurturing skills and talent for nearly 70 years, the factory closed in 2006 and, with no plan to archive the factory's material history, employees took it upon themselves to preserve as much of the factory and its design history as possible.

Sekers Objects will work with the local community to source objects and stories and curate a digital archive, exhibition and associated workshops that will enable people of all ages to engage with their local heritage.
